Program Information

With a *Professional Safety and Health Officer* certificate students will acquire the skills needed for experienced safety professionals to be hired and promoted

- OSHA 10- and 30-hour Outreach Trainer authorization
- How to create a safety culture in the workplace that includes leadership commitment, organization-wide safety communication and safety training as an investment for the organization
- The knowledge, skills and tools needed to conduct accident and incident investigations
- Leadership and communication skills including constructive intervention, fostering two-way dialogue, setting and maintaining expectations and alignment of values around safety

Target Audience

The curriculum is directed at existing safety professionals with at least five (5) years' experience in the field – a minimum requirement to complete the OSHA Outreach Trainer courses. Professionals with the desire to excel in mid-level management and leadership positions in safety with the need for skills used to implement safety standards in their workplace are highly encouraged to apply.

Demand and Job Prospects

Certificate holders may qualify for positions such as:

- Safety Consultant
- Environmental, Health, and Safety EHS Leader
- Plant Safety Leader
- Safety Manager
- Senior Safety Technician

Industry Certification

All courses offered have been approved for:

- American Board of Industrial Hygiene (ABIH) Certification Maintenance (CM) points
- Board of Certified Safety Professional (BCSP) Continuance of Certification (COC) points
- Bureau of Registered Nurses (BRN) credit

Time to Complete

Can be completed in as little as three to six months, although many students prefer to take one year or more.

Students have 5 years to complete the certificate from the date of the first class taken.

Steps to completing the PSHO certificate:

1. Determine if the PSHO certificate is right for you by reviewing the information on this document.
2. Visit the [PSHO Certificate page](#) through the UCSD OSHA Training website and select "Apply Now".
3. Fill out the application with your relevant details and submit the application.
4. Log into your [My Extension](#) account, if you do not have a My Extension account, select "Create an Account"
5. Select "My Applications" from the top of the screen
6. Select "Pay Certificate Fee" and pay the \$95.00 non-refundable certificate fee
7. Take all required coursework for the certificate program.

Once you have completed all of your requirements:

1. Log into your My Extension account and select "My Courses"
2. Select "Request Certificate Audit" from the certificate program listed on your record.
3. Your certificate will be awarded and mailed to you after all final grades are posted.
